A few notes of information.....from the desk of the Chief of Police,

Crime Issues

Second Degree Assault- Shoppers Food Warehouse, 3800blk. Bladensburg Road, Wednesday, June 24, 2015, 12:30PM, victim reported that the suspect, B/M, approx. 17 years old, had struck him while in the line over mistaken identity after someone else had said something about his Aunt over the amount of groceries she had. The suspect accused the victim of being a racist. The suspect then continued to follow the victim outside where he then pushed that person into a trash can causing them to fall at which time the victim tried to defend himself. The suspect and his Aunt then fled in unknown vehicle towards DC on Bladensburg Road. The victim reported minor injuries.

First Degree Assault- 4300blk. Newton St., Tuesday, June 30, 2015, 12:11AM, victim reported that he was having a domestic with his girlfriend in front of their residence. A friend of the girlfriend intervened to break up the dispute. At this time the girlfriend ran to get help when the suspect exited there home with a handgun and fired it 3 times striking the victims rear driver's side door of their vehicle as he was attempting to flee the scene after striking a parked vehicle. There were no injuries reported. Detectives from PGPD Northern Regional Investigation responded to scene to assume investigation. The suspect was later arrested on July 1, 2015 by Detectives from PGPD.

There continues to be loud noise complaints in reference to parties in town on the weekends. Please be courteous to your neighbors and control the noise to an acceptable level or even let your neighbors know in advance of the event. The police officers have been instructed to issue citations for violations of the Prince George's County Ordinance Sec.19-126., Noise in a Residential Area between 9:00PM-7:00AM that carries fines of **\$250** for the 1st. Offense and **\$500** for the 2nd. Offense.

Back to School Safety Tips

As summer draws to a close, back-to-school season is in full effect. Remember to safely share the roads with school buses, pedestrians and bicyclists, and provide children with the necessary knowledge to stay safe at school.

1. Walking to school

Review your family's walking safety rules.

Walk on the sidewalk, if one is available. When on a street with no sidewalk, walk facing the traffic.

Before you cross the street, stop and look left, right and left again to see if cars are coming.

Never dart out in front of a parked car.

Practice walking to school with your child. Cross streets at crosswalks when available.

2. Riding a bicycle to school

Make sure your child always wears his/her helmet when leaving the house.

Make sure helmet is fitted and secured properly.

Teach your children the rules of the road.

Ride on the right side of the road, with traffic, and in a single file.

Come to a complete stop before crossing the street.

Walk bike across street.

3. Riding the bus to school

Go to the bus stop with your child to teach them the proper way to get on and off the bus.

Make sure your children stand six feet away (or 3 giant steps) from the curb.

If your child and you need to cross the street in front of the bus, walk on the side of the road until you are 10 feet ahead of the bus. You always should be able to see the bus driver, and the bus driver always should be able to see you.

4. School Safety

Many school-related injuries are completely preventable.

Follow these steps to ensure your child's safety at school.

Preventing backpack-related injuries

Chose a backpack for your child carefully.

It should have ergonomically designed features to enhance safety and comfort.

Don't overstuff a backpack; it should weigh no more than 10 to 20 percent of your child's body weight.

Ask your children to use both straps when wearing their backpack to evenly distribute the weight on their shoulders.

Fall Safety Tips

When the weather turns cold most people spend more time inside their homes using fireplaces, furnaces, and heaters to keep warm. There's nothing quite as cozy as a fire, but it presents some safety hazards. Keep these tips in mind.

Service Your Furnace

Before the cold autumn and winter weather sets in, be sure to call your heating and cooling company to service your furnace. A specialist should inspect the furnace to make sure everything is in working order and that there are no leaks.

Use Fireplaces Safely

Keep that fire in its proper place by using a fireplace screen to keep sparks from flying out of the fireplace. Never leave a burning fire unattended, and make sure a fire in a fireplace is completely out before going to bed.

Use Caution with Space Heaters

A space heater can be an effective way to warm up a chilly room, but it's essential that you read the instructions on the unit before you use it. If your space heater requires venting, make sure you have vented it to the outdoors. Never use your stove or oven to heat your home; only use space heaters that are approved for this purpose. Always allow at least three feet of empty area around space heaters.

Exercise Candle Caution

Candles are a great way to give a room that warm glow, but they can also cause fires. According to the National Candle Association, almost 10,000 home fires start with improper candle use. Never leave candles burning if you go out or go to sleep, and keep your candles away from pets and kids.

Change Smoke Alarm Batteries

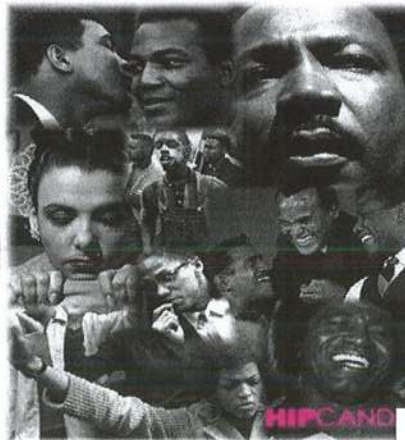
Change the batteries in your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors when you turn back your clocks for Daylight Saving Time. Make sure to check the alarms with the new batteries installed. Check and replace any home fire extinguishers that have expired.

Curbside Residential Single Stream Recycling



Acceptable Items

Glass ALL Food and beverage containers

Metals

- Empty aerosol cans
- Aluminum, bimetal, ferrous, and steel food and beverage containers
- Aluminum foil
- Coat hangers

Mixed Paper/Corrugated Cardboard

- All paper
- Aseptic/gable-top milk and juice cartons
- Catalogs
- Flattened corrugated cardboard (boxes)
- Frozen food packaging
- Hard- and soft- covered books
- Kraft paper bags and wrapping paper
- Magazines
- Newspapers with inserts
- Paper board (cereal and cracker boxes)
- Telephone books

Plastics

- Drinking cups/glasses
- Flower pots
- Narrow-neck containers with code identification numbers 1 through 7
- Wide-mouth containers such as peanut butter, yogurt, cottage cheese, sour cream, mayonnaise and whipped topping; margarine/butter tubs;
- Empty prescription bottles
- Coat hangers

Remember to rinse all food and beverage containers and to recap or place the lids in the recycling cart/bin.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- Auto parts / Motor oil containers
- Broken glass / Windowpanes
- Dishes
- Electronics
- Hazardous materials
- Light bulbs
- Medical waste
- Mirrors
- Packing foam and peanuts
- Plastic utensils
- Paper towels/ toilet paper

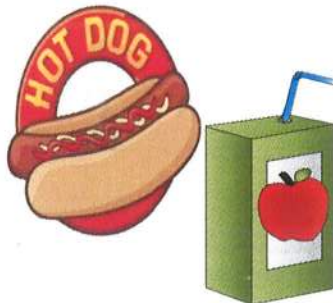

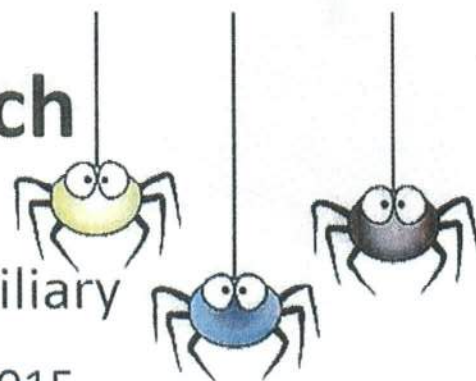

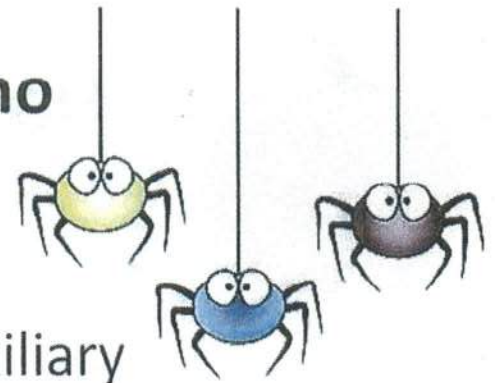
